

Symphony Groups To Present Klein

Three works by Dr. Lothar Klein, assistant professor of music, will be presented in the coming weeks by four American symphony orchestras as part of a new music project of the Rockefeller Foundation. Klein will appear at each concert.

The project is designed to broaden the repertoire of established orchestras and to bring newer compositions to the at-

tention of the younger generation.

His "Musique a Go-Go" will be presented in the Cleveland area April 13-15 by the Cleveland Orchestra directed by George Szell.

On April 20, the Houston Symphony Orchestra will perform Dr. Klein's short comic piece, "Charivari," at the University of Houston.

The composer's "Second Symphony" is scheduled for presentation April 28 through May 1 by the New Orleans Philharmonic in concerts at Tulane University and the University of Southern Mississippi, Hattiesburg.

The Kansas City Philharmonic will include "Charivari" in its appearances May 2-4 at the University of Kansas, Lawrence.

At each of the performances, Dr. Klein will be a guest of the orchestra, attending rehearsals, lecturing and participating in symposiums. Among topics he will discuss are the historical problems of newer music and the composer's freedom of choice.
