DR. LOTHAR KLEIN and his compositions have received the following honors recently:

 Last November, his "Dance Concerto for Clarinet and Jazz Band" was used to accompany Shirlee Dodge's choreography in the Drama Department's ballet production of "The Prodigal Son."

• The Louisville Symphony Orchestra recorded his "Musique à Go-Go" for the First Editions label last year, and the recording has been issued.

 He presented an invited paper entitled Looking Backwards to the annual meeting of the National Aesthetics Society in Santa Fe last October.

 The Dallas Symphony performed the first movement of his "Symphony No. 2," and also his "Appassionato," in January

of this year.

• DR. KLEIN'S "Nocturne for Soprano with 13 Solo Instruments" was named first prize winner in its category in the 1967 Texas Composers Guild Contest.

• Of greatest personal satisfaction to him was the fact that his "Musique à Go-Go" was one of only four works by American composers chosen by conductor George Szell for special performance by the Cleveland Orchestra in April.

 His compositions were featured also by the Houston, New Orleans, and Kansas City symphony orchestras last spring.

• Then, to climax a most successful year, he received First Prize in a national choral competition sponsored by the World Sacred Music Library of Cincinnati. DR. KLEIN'S prizewinning work, "Lament," is a three-movement piece for a cappella choir.
